











In the second half of 2024, the percentage of women in the program increased by 112% compared to the first half of 2023, while the population served increased by 11% over the same period, demonstrating the efforts made to prioritize the presence of women at Trapezistak.







# RESIDENTIAL RESOURCES - BREAKDOWN






# Typology of residential resources as of 08/31/2024:





- ✓ The Trapezistak program has 280 beds, which means it can serve 70% of the people in resources from the entities that make up
  the network (whether their own home, leased or rented by them),
- ✓ 46 people are in the free rental market, renting rooms either with their own financial means or through the program.
- ✓ 30 people live, in innovative models (intergenerational apartments, student apartments, cohabitation with local workers), which represents 7.58% of the total population served as of August 31, 2024.

## Trapezistak 2023 Objective



- intersectoral cooperation

#### **6 dimensions** of attention:

- √ administrative/functional
- ✓ educational/training
- ✓ housing and coexistence
- ✓ personal development and autonomy
- ✓ social and community capital
- ✓ employment and income




# Managed places: 2023



## **Evolution of the number of managed places**

Throughout the year, there has been an **upward** trend **in** the number of places available in the Program.

The **reasons** for this **increase** have been:



Consolidation of the increase in places generated in the 2022.

Progressive increase of 30 places in Araba and 5 in Gipuzkoa, as planned in the initial planning and budget.


An increase of 15 positions is due to budget control and the emitigfunds generated by the review of the Employment Intermediation benefit, based on prioritization criteria:

- accompanying women.
- residential models that fit what is defined in the Project (intergenerational / student apartments).



## The reasons for the 206 departures were:



**Objectives achieved:** the emancipation objectives set by the program have been reached.

**Abandonment:** decision made by the person himself.

**Expulsion:** decision made by the program, usually for non-compliance with regulations.


**Consensual exit:** a decision made by both the individual and the program due to exceptional circumstances.



Of the 72% of those released who **achieved** the program's emancipation **goals (149 people)**, this represents 24.75% of the total number of people served in 2023.

# **Educational/training dimension**



Work in this area allows people to undertake highly qualified training processes that are highly employment-oriented.

This makes administrative regularization possible in many cases through a work permit.

## In 2023, of the 606 people served, an average of:

- √ 36% have managed to obtain a Professional Certificate
- ✓ 25% have achieved a degree in Basic Vocational Training




- **√** 88% continue in training processes leading to official qualifications
- √ 42% have high levels (B2 or higher) in Spanish
- √ 14% have intermediate levels (A2) in Basque



## **Housing and Coexistence Dimension**







#### In the 2nd half of 2023\*:

- The Habitat objectives (home organization, cleanliness, and maintenance, as well as proper compliance with rules of coexistence) are met by 81% of the total population served in the Trapezistak program.
- 71 % of those served achieve goals in **purchasing** habits, healthy eating, and food preservation.
- Coexistence objectives are achieved with 69% of the people served.
- **36**% of the people served have a high level of compliance in their **independent housing search**: They have the skills to do so **.** 60 people have been actively searching for housing.

# **Social and Community Capital Dimension**




Having a supportive social network is crucial to developing any person's life plan, with direct implications in every dimension.



Equal access to leisure and culture is a fundamental element in building socialization processes and spaces for coexistence that foster diversity and integration.

In the second half of the year\*, following the trend for 2023, the results in this dimension show worrying values, and a challenge for future work, with implications not only for the people participating in the program, but for the entire community.

## **Employment and Income Dimension**




In the second half of the year\*, 9% of those served entered the workforce.

Of these, 24 people have signed a regularized contract for more than one year, with a salary equal to or greater than the minimum wage and full-time. Added to this, the 63 people who did so in the first half of the year, this provides a forecast of 87 people entering the labor market with the conditions the program defines as successful by 2023.



- To this figure we must add **another 18** people who, although **incorporated into the workforce**, do not meet any of the criteria to be considered objective fulfilled (due to the type of work schedule or the duration of the contract, for example).
- Although it is not a goal of the program, it is worth mentioning that 8% of people have accessed financial benefits, either by collecting RGI or some other type of benefit.

# **Trapezistak Program: Achievements 2023**



☑ The program has been able to transform its budget surplus into increasing the number of places, thus serving a significant number of people.



☑ The program has been able to increase the number of women supported compared to other periods. This has allowed for a segmented analysis of results by gender and region.



☑ The program has been able to strengthen the network of collaborating entities with positive results and incorporate the Álava region, which has consolidated the Program's presence throughout the Basque Country.



# **Trapezistak Program: Achievements 2023**



☑ The program has been able to effectively manage its financial resources within its budget. It has been able to manage regular payments to collaborating entities, thus contributing to its sustainability.



☑ The program has been able to create new tools tailored to the objectives of emancipation. Improved measurement has made it possible to identify both strengths and weaknesses in the different dimensions of emancipation and, as a result, to develop proposals tailored to the challenges faced.



☑ The program has been able to establish participatory practices with collaborating entities and take steps toward the participation of young people.



☑ The program has been able to systematically and effectively coordinate the different levels that comprise it.



# **Trapezistak Program: Challenges 2024**



#### **Support**:

 Manage the needs of the applicant list as well as the various stakeholders who have contacted the Program to learn about access to the program. These stakeholders include social organizations and public administrations.



#### **Budget**:

- The proposed increase in places must consider an increase in case coordination and case promotion based on the established ratio.
- Review of the price of benefits, taking into account the increase in the cost of living (and especially in access to housing).
- Examine the costs related to immigration procedures, since given the population served by the program, this is a significant cost.
- Consider expenses related to specific activities arising from both the Technical Secretariat and case coordinators, such as events dedicated to participation, specialized training, among others.



# **Trapezistak Program: Challenges 2024**



#### **Steering Group**:

 Systematize the Steering Group's tasks and meetings. Agree on proposed topics to be addressed, their prioritization, meeting frequency, and attendees.

#### **Digital transformation**

• Plan and define the **digital transformation of the monitoring and evaluation system**. The increase in the number of people served, their turnover, and the complexity of the current measurement system have highlighted the need for a tool that automates many of the existing processes. This will improve information, streamline the processes involved in this system, reduce errors in data collection, and provide new possibilities for systematizing and analyzing results.

#### **Communication:**

- Generate ways and spaces to communicate the program and raise awareness in the community
- Newsletter: Improve the design and make the newsletter reach a larger audience.


# **Trapezistak Program: Challenges 2024**



#### • Labour dimension :



- Contact business networks (federations, associations, etc.) creating references for the program.
- Create a communication channel with Lanbide, and in turn, work on communication with vocational training centers and Lanbide collaborators.
- Relationship with Labor Intermediation Networks (Hirekin).
- Research into new models, initiatives, projects, and more within and outside the Basque Country
- Housing dimension: Taking into account the current reality of the real estate market in the Basque Country, analyze the amount of housing benefits, as well as develop proposals to improve access to housing.



• Social and community participation dimension: generate a driving force that proposes how Trapezistak members want to organize themselves as a collective and participate in the program. The goal is to raise collective awareness among program participants and explore possible avenues for participation within the program.


# **Trapezistak Program: Monitoring system**



Trapezistak has a monitoring system that offers monthly updated information on each young person.

As part of the improvement policy, in June 2023 an improvement was made to the measurement tool that has allowed us to establish both half-yearly and annual cohort periods in which to measure all the people served. That is why this report presents data for the second half of 2023, the first half of 2024, the second half of 2024 and the whole of 2024.



81.7% ( **397 people** ) **continue in the process** towards emancipation




18.3% (89 people) have left the program for different reasons:

**Abandonment:** decision made by the person himself. **Expulsion:** decision made by the program, usually for noncompliance with regulations.



6.3% ( 31 people ) have left the program without achieving the emancipation objectives .

12% (58 people) have completed their stay at Trapezistak, achieving the program's emancipation objectives.

## SOME RESULTS. TRAINING





- √ 69% continue in training processes that lead to official qualifications
- √ 31% have high levels (B2 or higher) in Spanish
- √ 14% have intermediate levels (A2) in Basque

## SOME RESULTS. HOUSING







#### In the first half of 2024:

- The **Habitat goal achievement rate** (home organization, cleanliness, and maintenance, as well as proper adherence to rules of coexistence) is **87**% among the total population served in the Trapezistak program.
- 75 % of those served achieve goals in purchasing habits, healthy eating, and food preservation.
- Coexistence objectives are achieved with 69% of the people served.
- 37% of the people assisted have a high level of compliance in the independent search for housing: They have the skills to do so.

**85 people have been actively searching for housing**. Only **28.5% have been successful**. The difficulty of accessing the real estate market is evident, defining it as one of the program's greatest challenges.

## SOME RESULTS. SOCIAL CAPITAL AND COMMUNITY PARTICIPATION



In the first half of 2024, following the trend already seen in 2023, the results in this dimension show worrying values, and pose a challenge for future work, with implications not only for the program participants but for the entire community.



## SOME RESULTS. EMPLOYMENT AND ECONOMIC INCOME



By the first half of 2024, **10**% of those served **will have entered** the workforce.

- Of the 50 people who signed a regularized contract, 78% were permanent, with a salary equal to or greater than the minimum wage and full-time. The remaining contracts signed did not meet any of the criteria for success (due to the type of working hours or the length of the contract, for example).
- 16.2 % of the total population served has activated the employment intermediation benefit. The percentage of people with activated employment intermediation benefits who have accessed a paid professional contract or internship is 72%.
- 9.6% of the people assisted have accessed economic benefits, in this case, RGI.
